

Our goal is to empower students with the confidence and resilience to achieve success, while showing respect and care for others within our school and the wider community.





As a Parent/Carer, you set the standards and expectations for your child. Good attendance and punctuality are life skills. Good attendance helps pupils learn better, sustain friendships and enjoy school life.

In order for children to get the most out of their time at Thorpedene Primary School & Nursery, they need to attend every day. We endeavour to encourage children to obtain good attendance. Children are offered rewards for continued good attendance. If a child is ill, Parents/Carers are expected to contact the school by 9.00am on the first day of absence either by email, phoning the School Office or reporting the absence on the school app.

Holidays must not be taken during term times and the Headteacher will only authorise absence in term times due to exceptional circumstances. All absences from school are recorded, as are the reasons for absence. In the case of unexplained absence or where persistent absence becomes a concern, the Local Authority Attendance Team will work with the school and families to improve attendance.



Thorpedene Primary School & Nursery aims to give equality of opportunities to all our pupils. All members of staff are committed to providing a friendly, caring learning environment in which all children are encouraged to achieve their potential, irrespective of gender, race, social class, religion, special needs or disability. We value each child's contribution to the school community and positively encourage respect for, and understanding of cultural and social diversities.

At Thorpedene Primary School & Nursery, we welcome children with disabilities and special educational needs. Children's progress is regularly monitored by Teachers and if a child appears to have a particular difficulty, this will be discussed with the Special Educational Needs Co -Ordinator (SENCo).

Most support is given within the class through planned quality first teaching and working in small intervention groups with Learning Support Assistants. Specialist support may be given through withdrawal and individually personalised support. At Thorpedene Primary School & Nursery, we employ a Pastoral and Welfare Lead, Pupil Welfare Officer and Learning Mentors, to support our children, parents, and families. We also refer to outside agencies with specialised knowledge.



Behaviour

Our aim is to foster a school community where children can learn and develop as caring and responsible citizens. We recognise that within a climate of inclusion, there will be children who need a personalised approach to their specific behavioural needs.

At Thorpedene Primary School & Nursery, the safety and well-being of our children is our priority. We believe that all children should be kept free from harm and protected and that they should be given the opportunity to reveal how they feel in various situations. The school has effective multi-agency links where information can be appropriately shared to help children achieve and be successful.

Our staff take a collective ownership of ensuring that every pupil has an understanding of our Behaviour Policy and how to regulate their behaviour, so that they access our reward system to celebrate their positive choices. Each pupil is assigned to a 'House Team': Ruby, Emerald, Sapphire or Topaz and they have opportunities throughout each day to earn points for their House Team.

We recognise the children's achievements every week with a Celebration Assembly and award certificates linked to our school Core Values. We take behaviour seriously and this is why we also ensure that every pupil understands our sanctions and consequence system which is delivered consistently by all adults within our school, while adapting where needed, for the individual child's needs. Our behaviour system is positive and predictable for all of our pupils and we take pride in sharing our expectations with them as well as our parents and carers. School Uniform Expectations

All children will need a PE bag to keep their PE kit in. Long hair should be tied back. Children attend school on their dedicated PE day in their PE kit.

Our uniform guidance informs you of our expectations with regards to the Thorpedene school uniform. We believe that a smart uniform promotes unity and gives a sense of identity. Our uniform encourages a neat and tidy appearance which enables our pupils to feel good about themselves and take pride in their school. All children are expected to wear school uniform.

Hairstyles


Just as we expect children to dress appropriately for school, we also expect them to adopt a suitable, age-appropriate hairstyle. We actively discourage extreme hairstyles as they do not complement our school uniform. We consider extreme styles as hair colouring, tramlines, shaven heads and logos or any other style that could draw attention to the child and single them out from the rest of the school. If, as a school, we feel a hairstyle is unsuitable we will ask for this to be rectified. Any hair long enough to be tied back should be. If a child comes to school with dyed or streaked hair, Parents/Carers will be contacted and asked to return it to its original colour.

Jewellery/Accessories

For health and safety reasons, we do not allow the wearing of any jewellery, other than a watch and small stud earrings. All jewellery must be removed prior to coming to school by the Parents/Carers, with the exception of small stud earrings which must be removed on PE days. Nail varnish, artificial nails, fake tan, make up and tattoo/transfers are not allowed to be worn in school.

Valuables

Children alone are responsible for any property they bring into school. Children are not allowed to bring in any toys, electronic equipment or devices as the school cannot be held responsible for any breakage or loss that occurs. Mobile phones should not be brought into school unless in exceptional circumstances (older children who take themselves home from school). In these instances, phones should be handed to the school office before school and collected after school.



Please make sure that we know how to reach you in an emergency by always ensuring the School Office is informed of any changes of address or

There may be times when a child becomes ill at school. Children who are hurt will be given immediate first aid. We may contact you so that you can collect your child. On the rare instance that hospital treatment is needed, emergency services will be contacted by the school at the same time as Parent/Carer.

Should your child have a long term illness for which they require regular medication/care, please note this on your admission form so that a Care Plan can be drawn up. The school First Aid Policy can be found under the Key Information tab on the school website. The school can only administer medicine as part of a Care Plan or antibiotics if it is required four times a day. You will be asked to sign a form authoring a member of staff to administer the

Children with inhalers for asthma encouraged to be responsible for their own medication, which is kept in class, to be used when required. It is the Parent's/Carer's responsibility to ensure the medication in school

If you have any concerns about the safety of a child, please do not hesitate to contact the

Recommended contents of a healthy lunch include:

- A good portion of starchy food e.g. bread, crackers, pasta or rice.
- Fruit or vegetables
- A portion of milk or dairy
- A drink e.g. milk, juice or a bottle of water
- One small biscuit, cake or cereal bar

Please also note:

- We are a nut free school so please ensure all snacks and packed lunches are nut free as we have a number of children with allergies.
- All children are expected to bring in a water bottle so they can drink water during the day.
- All children are provided with a free daily healthy snack.
- Special dietary requirements for allergies, religious or vegetarian requirements should be noted on the admission form.
- Children having school dinners must be able to use a knife and fork correctly.
- Good table manners are expected at all times.
- Sweets, chocolates and fizzy drinks are not allowed.



Our own kitchen prepares freshly cooked meals daily including vegetarian options. The menu is available from the School Office and website and runs on a three week rotation. Dinners are paid for at the beginning of each week using the BromCom MCAS app.

All children in Reception and Key Stage 1 are entitled to Universal Free School Meals. However, the school benefits from extra funding if you meet the eligibility criteria for Free School Meals so if you are entitled, we request that you apply via the Southend-on-Sea City Council's website (please see the School Office for more details).

Children can bring their own packed lunch into school or they may go home to lunch. Packed lunches should be clearly labelled with their name and class.

Thorpedene Primary School and Nursery is a nut free school so please ensure all snacks and packed lunches are nut free as we have a number of children with allergies.

Helping Your Child At Home

You can help your child by:

- Building links with your child's Teacher by communicating key information and attending Parent Consultation sessions.
