Starting Reception

- It's important to us that Reception is a happy, safe and nurturing environment as well as an exciting and positive learning environment. We hope that the children will adapt to whole school life very quickly and before you know it, they will be a full-member of the Thorepedene family.
- The children will soon get used to their class routines, make friends and get to know their teachers and other adults who will be working with them.
- Our Reception staff work hard to provide a rich array of highly stimulating and engaging learning environments and opportunities.
- Children gain confidence from their good relationships with staff and collaborative play with each other.

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Online Learning Journal

At Thorpedene Primary we use a secure online Learning Journal website called Tapestry to record the children's learning through photos and observations. This provides a two-way communication tool between school and home. Class teachers and support staff will add observations and photos of the children learning weekly. These will be added primarily by each child's key class teacher who will be following their progress and development throughout their time in Reception.

Parents will be sent a link through an email to enable them to register and sign up for their child's online learning journal. We encourage you to sign up and engage with us to foster a healthy parent partnership.



Uniform

Grey shorts, grey trousers

Any earrings must be removed by the child themselves for P.E lessons or before school.

All P.E kit should be stored in a P.E drawstring bag

A typical day in Reception

- Our 'normal' times and sessions are:
- Morning session: welcome and child-led activities from 8.35am 9am registration time, flowed by planned and child-led activities including Phonics.
- Lunch time-11.45am- 12:45 including outdoor play after lunchtime.
- Afternoon session: Registration time- 12:50pm followed by yoga then planned and child-led activities including Maths.
- ▶ End of day: 3.15 pm
- Children will only be handed over to people listed on the contact form. Please inform staff or the school office if someone new is picking your child up.

School Transition Dates


Stay and Play sessions-

Things to work on over the summer..

- To ensure your child can go to the toilet on their own and wipe themselves.
- Play games with your child that involve counting to ten or beyond eg hide and seek and counting the stairs as you walk up or down them.
- Encourage sharing whilst playing group games with family and friends.
- Conversational skills.
- Practice dressing and undressing themselves in preparation for PE.
- Complete talking transitions activities.
